Green policies



As a good NHS organisation, we must try to have a good effect on our local people. In this case **sustainability** is about using natural resources well, for the good of local people and the environment they live in.

Buying for **Sustainable Development** means buyers try to improve the future of an organisation and the way it provides services and how it links with people in the community.



Green policies

With costs rising, it's important to make sure local health organisations stay strong. Everyone has a part to play in this.



Green policies

There are some key things to think about. These are:

- How patients can look after their own health and long-term conditions,
- Checking medicines to cut the number of prescriptions that aren't really needed
- New ways of care being introduced through GP practices.

We have written a Green Plan (you can find it on our website). This tells you how we work in an **ethical** and sustainable way. It gives clear targets, so we will know how well we have done.

Checking our green plan is working is part of everything we do. Showing how we think about our local people and environment makes sure we follow the rules we need to.



Green policies

In 2018 the NHS published its Long-Term Plan. This shows how the NHS will change in the next 10 years and the money put aside for the NHS over the next five years to help make those changes happen.



Green policies

We have a sustainability **mission statement**. This says, we will:

- Plan and buy health and social care in line with our green plan
- Be a green organisation and ask our GP Practices to do the same
- Check we are doing what we said we would
- Buy services are safe and work well.
- Buy high quality services, that show the best value for money, and protect our local environment
- Cut out waste
- Focus on prevention
- Talk to patients and the public and involve them in what we do
- Protect **community assets**
- Make the best us of what we have
- Cut our carbon emissions



Green policies

As a part of the NHS, public health and social care system, cut our carbon emissions carbon emissions (on a 1990 start), by

- Around a third by 2020
- Around half by 2025 (We will also try to improve air quality by cutting pollution from business mileage and vehicles by a fifth by 2023-24)
- Ensuring that most of the NHS fleet uses low-emissions engines by 2028
- Phasing out coal and oil fuel in NHS sites



Green policies

With support from co-workers, we think about the risks to the environment local people and business before we buy. If such a risk is noticed this is looked at before and during the period when we talk to possible providers. We think about how to include this in any designs and buying documents.

We know the health and care system makes up a large proportion of road traffic. We will try to reduce the impact of our travel and transport on the environment as well as using new technologies where we can.

We will try to make sure buildings for providing health services are designed with sustainability in mind where possible.



Green policies

We rent our office space at Number One Riverside from RBC which holds between about 1,700 RBC and CCG staff, public facing services and public areas.

Information on our use of use of energy, water and recycling is not available as the CCG is based within Number One Riverside. However, will reduce our environmental impact by;

- Turning off lights when leaving meeting rooms
- Turning off PCs, monitors and all chargers when not in use
- Turning off all equipment when not in use
- Encourage a paperless office



Green policies

We will try to reduce our carbon footprint by;

- **Energy** – working with partners to cut the use of non-renewable energy sources and look for other sources and technology to reduce use of energy across all activities
- **Waste** – cut the amount of waste we make and its impact by trying to cut, reuse, recycle and recover otherwise redundant resources
- **Transport** – we will keep trying to reduce the environmental impact of transport including unneeded travel.



Green policies

Events such as heatwaves, cold snaps and flooding are expected to rise as because of climate change. To ensure our services continue to meet the needs of our local population during such events, we have several plans and rules ready with our partners.



Green policies

We know green space and **biodiversity** play a big part in helping patients get better and help staff wellbeing. We will help change these areas, through funding to provider organisations improving or replacing buildings and protecting the natural environment, including the prevention of pollution.

By working with the Local Care Organisation (LCO) – One Rochdale Health and Care we provide the personal care valued by both patients and GPs. By working in partnership we can grow care designed jointly by clinicians and service users.



Green policies

We know our workforce plays a big part in keeping a sustainable organisation and we will try to attract and keep talented people and build a great place to work. We will keep doing this by:

- workforce training programmes
- setting objectives in annual **staff appraisals** that link sustainability to specific roles and responsibilities
- link to local, regional and national projects to manage our sustainability work

We have no direct control over the use of natural resources due to renting office space. However we will try to reduce energy usage by turning off all equipment when not in use.

We will carry on trying to use of recyclable stationery and use recycling bins as well as general waste bins. We will reduce printing, print double sided and in black and white.

Sustainable development – ways of working that will keep the organisation working well and protect the local environment and local people.

Sustainability – the power to keep going

Ethical – honest, following a good moral policy, doing things for good reasons

Mission statement – a statement describing the key aims of an organisation and how it intends to get there

Community assets – things of value that exist in a community. It could be local skilled people, key buildings like community centres, or partnerships working for the good of the community.

Sustainable Development Assessment Tool - It is an online self-checking tool to help organisations understand their sustainable development work. It helps check progress and help make plans.

Corporate approach – the way a business does things

Asset management & utilities - using resources such as money, buildings, people, and energy resources in the best way possible.

Travel and logistics – moving people or goods from one place to another

Adaptation – making change to do things better

Capital projects – projects that use money to improve buildings, roads etc.

Green space & biodiversity – Using green spaces and nature responsibly where each part, no matter how small, all have an important role to play.

Sustainable care models - Changing the way care is given to grow a

type of care that looks at the clinical side but also all the things that it may affect or be affected by. This means thinking about the environment and the impacts of services on people.

Our people – the people that work in or visit our organisation

Sustainable use of resources – using funds and materials responsibly so they can grow and not run out.

Biodiversity - all the different species and forms of life on the planet (animals, plants, people etc.)
