We are checked each year by **NHS England**. NHS England have a plan for checking CCGs in 2019-20 and it looks at how well we work jointly with partners to improve quality and results for patients.



CCGs must target the strength and effectiveness of how we relate to other organisations and make progress in this area.




We are checked against several targets across the full year. This is added to how well we use our money and how well NHS England think we are led for an overall score

How we do against our aims is reported to the **Integrated Commissioning Board (ICB)** every two months. ICB is a shared group and has been given power from both our Governing Body and RBC Cabinet for the joint budget between health and social care.

We are checked by NHS England for the delivery of the NHS Long-Term Plan (January 2019) which sets out all the measures we must meet to perform well.


We are measured against some of the statements in our constitution, these are:

- Provide easy access to services within the waiting times set out in the Handbook to the NHS Constitution
- Make decisions in an open honest way, so that patients and the public know how services are planned and delivered
- Make the change as smooth as possible when you are moved between services, and to put you, your family and carers at the centre of decisions that affect you or them



Performance

Quarterly checking meetings with Greater Manchester Health and Social Care partnership we can show that actions are in place to deliver on key issues



Difficult or unusual words

Performance analysis – checking how well you have done against targets you have set

NHS Oversight Framework – a plan with a set of targets and how they are measured which tests if CCGs are doing as well as they should be

Governing Body – the senior officers, councilors, clinicians and lay members who are responsible for running the organization.

Audit Committee - a group that looks at the clinical commissioning group's financial reporting and ways of working and makes sure things are being done properly and the best way possible

Finance Performance and Risk subgroup - Working under the RBC Cabinet and CCG Governing Body, the Sub Group will check the pooled budgets overall financial position, activity, and any risk.

Integrated Commissioning Board - group made up of RBC councilors, CCG Governing Body members senior officers and clinicians that examines and makes decisions about buying healthcare services for local people.

Assurance – having confidence that something has been done properly or in the way expected.

Safeguarding - is the action that is taken to help the welfare of children and adults who could be at risk and protect them from harm

NHS England - The organisation that makes sure the NHS is working properly and buys special types of services
